this general introduction to the arabic language now available in paperback places special emphasis on the history and variation of the language concentrating on the difference between the two types of arabic the classical standard language and the dialects kees versteegh charts the history and development of the arabic language from the earliest beginnings to modern times the reader is offered a solid grounding in the structure of the language its historical context and its use in various literary and non literary genres as well as an understanding of the role of arabic as a cultural religious and political world language intended as an introductory guide for students of arabic it will also be a useful tool for discussions both from a historical linguistic and from a socio linguistic perspective coverage includes all aspects of the history of arabic the arabic linguistic tradition arabic dialects and arabic as a world language links are made between linguistic history and cultural history while the author emphasises the role of contacts between arabic and other languages this important book will be an ideal text for all those wishing to acquire an understanding or develop their knowledge of the arabic language

landmarks in linguistic thought vol 3 is devoted to a linguistic tradition that lies outside the western mainstream namely that of the middle east the reader is introduced to the major issues and themes that have determined the development of the arabic linguistic tradition each chapter contains a short extract from a translated landmark text followed by a commentary which places the text in its social and intellectual context the chosen texts frequently offer scope for comparison with the western tradition by contrasting the two systems the western and the middle eastern this book serves to highlight the characteristics of two very different systems and thus stimulate new ideas about the history of linguistics this book presumes no prior knowledge of arabo islamic culture and arabic language and is invaluable to anyone with an interest in the history of linguistics kees versteegh is currently professor of arabic and islam at the middle east institute of the university of nijmegen the netherlands his publications include the explanation of linguistic causes 1995 ed arabic outside the arab world 1994

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history and development of the arabic language is a general introduction for students to the history of the arabic language it is divided into two parts the pre islamic language up to the emergence of the first well known works of classical arabic secondly the transition from the pre islamic situation to the complex arabic language forms after the emergence of islam and the arab conquests both in arabia and in the diaspora the book focuses on the pre islamic linguistic situation where the linguistic geography and relevant demographic aspects of pre islamic arabia will be introduced in addition the book will also discuss the communicative contexts and varieties of modern arabic the book includes readings discussion questions and data sets to provide a complete textbook and resource for teachers and students of the history of arabic

the articles in this volume combine modern linguistic insights with the theories of arab grammarians the result is a series of studies on such aspects of the structure of arabic as conditional sentences adverbial clauses and the particles laqin and qad

in this volume the author examines the origins of arabic linguistics on the basis of the earliest qurānic commentaries 1st half of the 8th century and the material used includes both edited texts and manuscript commentaries various chapters analyze the exegetical methods of the early commentators such as muqātil and muhammad al kalbī and their use of grammatical terminology these data are compared with the earliest grammatical treatises such as sābawayhi and farrā the material presented here constitutes an important source of evidence for the development of linguistic thinking in islam and the origin of the grammatical schools of basra and kufa

this volume contains a selection of papers presented at the fifth conference on the foundations of arab linguistics held in cambridge 2018 the first part of the book deals with sābawayhi's *kitāb* the oldest known treatise of arabic grammar after

providing insights on some of its specific terminology these chapters evaluate its place as a source within the long term tradition of grammatical studies the second part of the book focuses on parallel developments in the arabic grammatical theory both in the classical and postclassical periods up to the 15th century some contributions also address the relationship between grammar and other disciplines notably philosophy and qur'ānic exegesis as such this volume aims to deepen our knowledge of the development of linguistic theories in the islamicate world

all contributions deal with the reception of theories in the arabic grammatical tradition from the time of sībawayhi d end of the 8th century c e to the later grammarians in the 14th century c e after sībawayhi considerable changes in the linguistic situation took place the language of the arab bedouin described by him died as a native language grammars also changed even if grammarians used for the most part the data given by sībawayhi this volume aims to determine continuities and changes in arabic grammars providing a new perspective on the impact of cultural and historical developments and on the founding principles of sībawayhi s *kitāb*

this volume contains sixteen contributions from the fourth conference on the foundations of arabic linguistics genova 2016 all having to do with the development of linguistic theory in the arabic grammatical tradition starting from sībawayhi s *kitāb* end of the 8th century c e and its continuing evolution in later grammarians up till the 14th century c e the scope of this volume includes the links between grammar and other disciplines such as lexicography and logic and the reception of arabic grammar in the persian and malay linguistic tradition

this book provides a synopsis of recently published empirical research into the acquisition of reading and writing in arabic its particular focus is on the interplay between the linguistic and orthographic structure of arabic and the development of reading and writing spelling in addition the book addresses the socio cultural political and educational milieu in which arabic literacy is embedded it enables readers to appreciate both the implications of empirical research to literacy enhancement and the challenges and limitations to the applicability of such insights in the arabic language and literacy context the book will advance the understanding of the full context of literacy acquisition in arabic with the very many factors religious historical linguistic etc that interact and will hence contribute to weakening the anglocentricity that dominates discussions of this topic

this book offers a comprehensive theory of arabicization in the middle east and egypt in the early period of the arab conquests it thereby draws on old arab grammarians coupled with modern research in second language acquisition

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
